AAA PANEL STIRS MAJOR CONTROVERSY

It was standing room only at the American Anthropological Association panel on "AIDS and the Social Imaginary" on December 5th in San Francisco. Local ACT-UP supporters were leafleting the meeting in protest. Several SOLGA (Society of Lesbian and Gay Anthropologists) members wore T-shirts which read "These Natives Can Speak for Themselves." Hotel security at the San Francisco Hilton were put on special alert. The event apparently drew the largest audience ever at an AIDS-related meeting of the AAA, probably even larger than the AAA Plenary Session on "AIDS: the Global Crisis" at the 1987 Chicago meetings.

The noontime panel, organized and co-chaired by Nancy Scheper-Hughes and Paul Rabinow (both of the University of California at Berkeley), had originally been turned down by the 1992 Program Chair, Martha Ward, but was then approved by the AAA administration. A primary concern about the panel, expressed by some members of SOLGA, was that it had been composed of several prominent anthropologists with limited or no experience in AIDS/HIV, and there was no representation on the panel by a person with HIV or at increased risk for HIV. The panelists included the two co-chairs, Jean Comaroff (University of Chicago), Renato Rosaldo (Stanford University), and Michael Taussig (New York University).

Dr. Comaroff discussed the latent racism of associating the origin of HIV with Africa. Dr. Rosaldo spoke of homosexuality and AIDS; Dr. Taussig read a stream of consciousness poem; Dr. Rabinow talked about health issues and leukemia; and Dr. Scheper-Hughes discussed AIDS in Brazil.

TASK FORCE ON AIDS REINSTATED

After originally deciding against renewing the mandate of the AAA Task Force on AIDS last Spring, the AAA Executive Committee has reversed itself by reinstating the Task Force until November 1993. Mr. John Cornman (Executive Director of the AAA) strongly supported a proposal to reinstate the Task Force for a one year period, after discussing the issue with Merrill Singer (Chair of the Task Force) and Task Force members William Leap and Douglas A. Feldman. There was grave concern among Task Force members that the work of the Task Force has not yet been completed, and that the implicit _ message being sent by ending its role might be seen by others as a policy. shift at the AAA away from support for AIDS and anthropology research and activities.

Mr. Cornman met with the Task Force at its semi-annual meeting in San Francisco on December 2nd. He explained that the AAA highly values the work of anthropologists on AIDS, but that under the new AAA reorganization program special interest groups will be developed

Ralph Bolton (SOLGA Co-Chair) led off the discussion following the panel by sharply criticizing the panel for becoming a papers session, allowing only 15 minutes for discussion and comments, even though the co-chairs had stated at the beginning of their panel that they wanted to encourage discussion. He also argued that the panel raised issues that were resolved by anthropologists working on AIDS several years ago, that it is wrong for anthropologists with little HIV-related experience to accept consulting positions on AIDS from international foundations, and that there should have been a person with HIV on the panel. Stephen O. Murray spoke next as a person with HIV in strongly attacking the nature of the panel.

A concern expressed by some members of the audience is the issue of homophobia within the anthropology profession. After Dr. Rosaldo, one of the panelists, recommended non-discrimination based upon sexual orientation within the profession, Sue-Ellen Jacobs (University of Washington) pressed him on whether he would support a tenured position on gay studies within the anthropology department of his university.

Since the turbulent panel, Mildred Dickemann (SOLGA Co-Chair) and Dr. Bolton have sent a letter to Annette Wiener (AAA President) and John Cornman (AAA Executive Director) expressing their deep concerns. They write, "The elitism of famous anthropologists arrogating to themselves the role of 'introducing and legitimizing the issues of AIDS for anthropologists,' in ignorance or disregard of all the work already undertaken and in process by qualified AIDS researchers, is unconscionable."

AARG is planning to hold a follow-up panel at the next AAA meetings in Washington, D.C. later this year. It will attempt to more clearly focus upon what should be the applied anthropological agenda concerning AIDS in the 1990's, will be chaired by Douglas A. Feldman (University of Miami), and has been titled "AIDS and the Socially Unimaginable."

which will continue the work of task forces on a more permanent basis. He suggested that the Task Force consider restructuring itself as an AAA special interest group after November 1993, and could give no assurance that the Executive Committee would reinstate the Task Force after November.

After Mr. Comman left the meeting, discussion and a vote was taken. The consensus was that the urgent work of anthropologists on AIDS will not end this November, that the commitment of the AAA in the struggle against AIDS should not be diminished, and that AARG is already functioning as a special interest group within the AAA. The vote was in favor of requesting that the AAA continue the Task Force beyond the November deadline, and disbanding if not continued.

AARG ELECTION RESULTS: AND THE WINNERS ARE ...

The ballots have been counted and the AARG election results are in. The new Chair-Elect for 1993 (and Chair for 1994) is Janet McGrath. Dr. McGrath is an Assistant Professor of Anthropology at Case Western Reserve University, has conducted AIDS research in Uganda, and has served as AARG Secretary since 1991. Douglas A. Feldman, the former Chair for 1992, has appointed Michael C. Clatts to the position of Secretary for 1993-95. Moses B. Pounds had been previously reappointed as Treasurer for 1993-95. The new Chair for 1993 is Norris G. Lang, who was elected last year.

Continuing Steering Committee members are Lucia Cargill (through 1993), Paul Farmer (1993), Douglas A. Feldman (1993), Betsy Randall-David (1994), and Merrill Singer (1994). There was a three-way tie in one of the four slots for new Steering Committee members, so the number of new slots was increased from four to six. Ralph Bolton, a former Chair of AARG, was re-elected to a three-year term on the Steering Committee. Francis Conant, Margaret M. Connors, Stephen L. Eyre, William L. Leap, and Claire Sterk-Elifson were elected to three-year terms (1993-95) on the Steering Committee.

BOLTON AND CONNORS WIN AARG PAPER PRIZES

Ralph Bolton (Pomona College) and Margaret M. Connors (RRI/TRITON, Washington, D.C.) are the winners of the first annual AARG paper prizes. The purpose of the awards is to encourage HIV-related research and publications by anthropologists. Merrill Singer (Chair of the AARG Paper Prizes Committee) said that he was pleased that the overall quality of the papers submitted was excellent, and that it was a difficult decision for his committee. Dr. Bolton won the professional paper prize for his paper on "Gay Baths Revisited; an Empirical Analysis." Ms. Connors won the student paper prize for her paper on "Stories of Pain and the Problem of AIDS Prevention: Injection Drug Withdrawal and Its Effect on Risk Behavior." Both winners will receive a check for \$100 from AARG.

The deadline for the second annual AARG paper prizes will be September 30, 1993. Papers should be original, 15-30 doublespaced typed pages, and the sole or first author must be an anthropologist, anthropology graduate student, or undergraduate anthropology major. It is no longer necessary to be an AARG member in order to submit. Previous winners are no longer eligible. All papers need to be in press, submitted to press, or unpublished at the time of submission.

OBITUARY

WILLIAM F. LEWIS, 51, died on July 11, 1992, in New York City. Dr. Lewis was an interdisciplinary humanist scholar with degrees in philosophy, theology, and music, in addition to anthropology. He received his Ph.D. in anthropology from the New School for Social Research in 1980, having studied with His scholarly work on the Rastafarian Stanley Diamond. movement was presented in papers at many anthropological meetings; in his article, "The Rastafari: Millennial Cultists or Unregenerate Peasants?" Peasant Studies, Fall 1986; and in an almost completed manuscript, Defiance to Accommodation: Social Context and the Rastafarian Movement, based on fieldwork in New York City, Jamaica, and Ethiopia. Bill was a Franciscan Brother and was committed to bringing the perspectives of cultural anthropology to his church community through publications and presentations. RESEARCH REPORT: HIV IN SAN FRANCISCO by Michael Gorman, Ph.D., M.P.H.

The San Francisco Men's Health Study is a longitudinal HIV study of gay, bisexual, and heterosexual men recruited in 1984 from 21 census tracts in San Francisco with the highest incidence of AIDS. In the Spring 1992, an additional 600 younger (18-29) men were interviewed and asked to be tested anonymously for HIV. An aspect of the study is to begin to document rituals of life transitions, including those rituals surrounding death due to HIV. Relationships of men, and caregiving patterns, within their biological families and their families of choice are being examined. We are also conducting a study on the feasibility of a future vaccine trial in this city. Recent work has focussed on changes in sexual behavior and recreational drug use among gay men, and an analysis of causes of death which have not been attributed to AIDS among the study participants.

Our findings indicate that gay men over 35 continue to use condoms for high risk sexual activities, especially for anal sex, and that mean numbers of partners have now returned to the levels of the early 1980's. An analysis of causes of death indicate that suicide is the leading cause of death after AIDS, giving San Francisco gay men a risk of suicide more than three times that of men in the overall population. Among younger men (under 30), 0.4% of heterosexual men were HIV positive, while (alarmingly) 21.9% of gay men were HIV positive. Seven percent of gay men under 24 were also HIV positive. We are currently conducted ethnographic research on the population to further understand patterns of sexual behavior and to develop a plan which would address bioethical issues of informed consent in a possible future vaccine trial.
